June 7

You've heard the stories and read the articles of the decline of the church. You probably know folks whose churches have been forced to close and others who are cutting budgets and staff to try and make ends meet. Even the mega churches, once thought to be the future of Christianity, are being hit by declines in attendance and membership.

So are Christianity and the church coming to an end? Well, the church "as we know it" may be fading, but God's Spirit is still at work creating something new out of what was! I see it in the new mission projects we're beginning, the Community Choir (don't miss the concert 6/14) and TimeBanking (rollout this summer). I see it in seven young people baptized on May 31 and another on June 7. I feel it as we reorganize for more mission and less meetings. And I especially see it as you continue to give of yourselves to make Heights Christian Church not a church of the past, but a church of the future. It is my honor and pleasure to travel that journey with you.

...from your Prayer Ministry

Last month we reflected on how we, through our identity with Jesus. are "beloved by God." (Remember the Baptism of Jesus when a voice spoke from the heavens: 'This is my Beloved Son.')? As much as we want to think kindly and even lovingly toward others, it's often hard for us to be accepting, forgiving and loving toward ourselves. It's not easy to believe that there is nothing we can do to earn God's love, nor are we able to lose God's love by any of our thoughts or actions. But it's true! And love changes you; love transforms you if you allow it.



Remember ... Re-connect. Two important words if we are to have love transform us. Some contemporary psychological therapies suggest that we can change our behaviors, even our selfimage by stating affirmations every day and often within that day. Consider this one: "God loves me more than I can imagine." Or, "God waits for me to listen."

A recent pamphlet from the Southern Poverty Law Center describes the 783 active hate groups that currently exist in the U.S. Those hate-filled hearts CAN be turned around by our own positive growth and prayer. We are all connected. Albert Einstein wrote that the thought that we are only individuals, unconnected to each other is wrong. He said that we have more points of connection than separation. We can affect each other. This month, let's keep repeating to ourselves affirmations such as "I am unconditionally loved by God." or "I can bring love to hate-filled hearts if I love unconditionally." We can make a difference.

BUILDING COMMUNITY



Did you know ... that the vision of Heights Christian Church has always been to look beyond itself into the human condition around the world and find ways to serve. When we were just a fledgling church, we reached out to support Dr. and Mrs. Donald Baker who served as medical missionaries to the Belgian Congo for 30 years. During the early 60's, the Bakers returned to

the U.S. and served as HCC Elders and Mrs. Baker taught in the Co-op Nursery School.

For decades Resettlement work was encouraged through our national Disciples office.

- ► In 1949, Christian Vipers, a professional photographer and his family were resettled from a Displaced Persons Camp after World War II.
- ▶ In 1960, Ben Camins, a Filipino, a theological student was fully supported while studying here and returned to the Philippines to serve as a pastor.
- ▶ In 1976, Pedro Quintana, a political prisoner from Chile, and his family were resettled here.
- ▶ In 1980, after the Vietnam War, three adult Vietnamese refugees held in Refugee Camps were supported by our church.
- ▶ In 1991, our most ambitious efforts began in resettling the Nikolenko and Petrenko families who were caught in the midst of a civil war in the Ukraine, and persecuted because they were Christians. Peter Nikolenko was a pastor and contacted Church World Service to help them escape. Tanya, Serge and their 3 children were the first to arrive. HCC members provided housing, tutoring in English and citizenship training. Jobs were provided by Dick Durham's painting and rehab business. They even set up Tanya in her cleaning business which continues successfully to this day.
- ▶ In 1992, (working with Ann Weisheimer who was at our Disciples headquarters) we arranged for the second wave of the Nikolenko family to come. Tanya's mother, Raisa, her father, Peter and two brothers, Alex and Greg and their families. (11 in all)
- ▶ In 1993, the third wave brought Serge Petrenko's family, father, mother and his two sisters and families. (10 in all.) And the final wave included Tanya's sister, from Siberia, who came with her family of four. (A total of 30 in all)

Today, as they celebrate 25 years here in America we are happy to report that all are U.S. citizens, own their own homes, their children have completed college, married and started families of their own. What a success story! The mother of this wonderful family, Raisa, resides at Campbell Court and now has a plot in our Community Garden. How fitting! And how much we have all learned from knowing them. The world and it's problems are more fully understood as we engage in this service of love.


